I have a lifetime of experience working with Indigenous children using a harm reduction approach, including over 20 years' in a professional capacity. My professional experience stems from working as a Head Start Instructor, Cree language instructor, education assistant, childcare provider and a high-risk childcare worker. I am a capable classroom manager where children are taught to build relationships through respecting, caring and supporting each other. Students are taught leadership in an open and inclusive process. This process leads my students to self-manage and take responsibility for their education.

Greetings from the Grade 6/7 Split Classroom -Harold Flett

I get to introduce myself as the new old teacher of Sally Ross School and I also wanted to express how important Culture and Land Base Learning is and how important it is to our lives. My name is Harold Flett. As a young boy at the age of seven I attended schools away from our parents. We were so grateful to spend 2 months of each summer with our parents. Every Saturday and Sunday our parents would pack up and take us camping out on the lake where we learned how they and grandparents had lived off the land and they made sure we exercised the culture they had received. Dad and mom taught us how to set up camp, fish, cleaned the fish, cook a good shoreline meal. During the week at home we had to check our gill-net daily to have our share of trout, whitefish and pickerel. The most exciting times is when we would venture all over the southern part of Reindeer Lake to visit families at their fishing camps. Yes, we lived in Southend. After 12 years in Southend, my parents were transferred to Cumberland House. Later in their lives they both passed away in Cumberland House and now, we consider Cumberland House as our home. We are actually from Big Trout Lake in Ontario. Kitchenuhmaykoosib Inninuwug

I have been assigned to teach the grade 6/7. I have a total of 23 students. 10 students are in Grade 6 and 13 students are in Grade 7. I try to get the learning packages to the homes by Friday. As parents, it is a good point to look over the assignments in the package as some assignments may have answer sheets to help you when your child is experiencing difficulty in arriving with the answer. We are encouraging parents to pull out the answer sheets so your child is challenged to do the work without help. When your child is experiencing difficulty that's when you bring out the answer sheets to assist them with the answers.

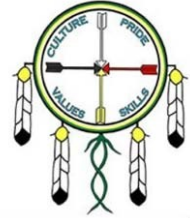

It is also a good idea to hold on to those crayons in a container for future assignments. I was lucky to grab the last set of classroom crayon box for my grade 6 and 7 group. 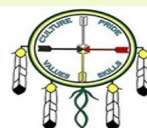

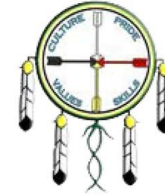

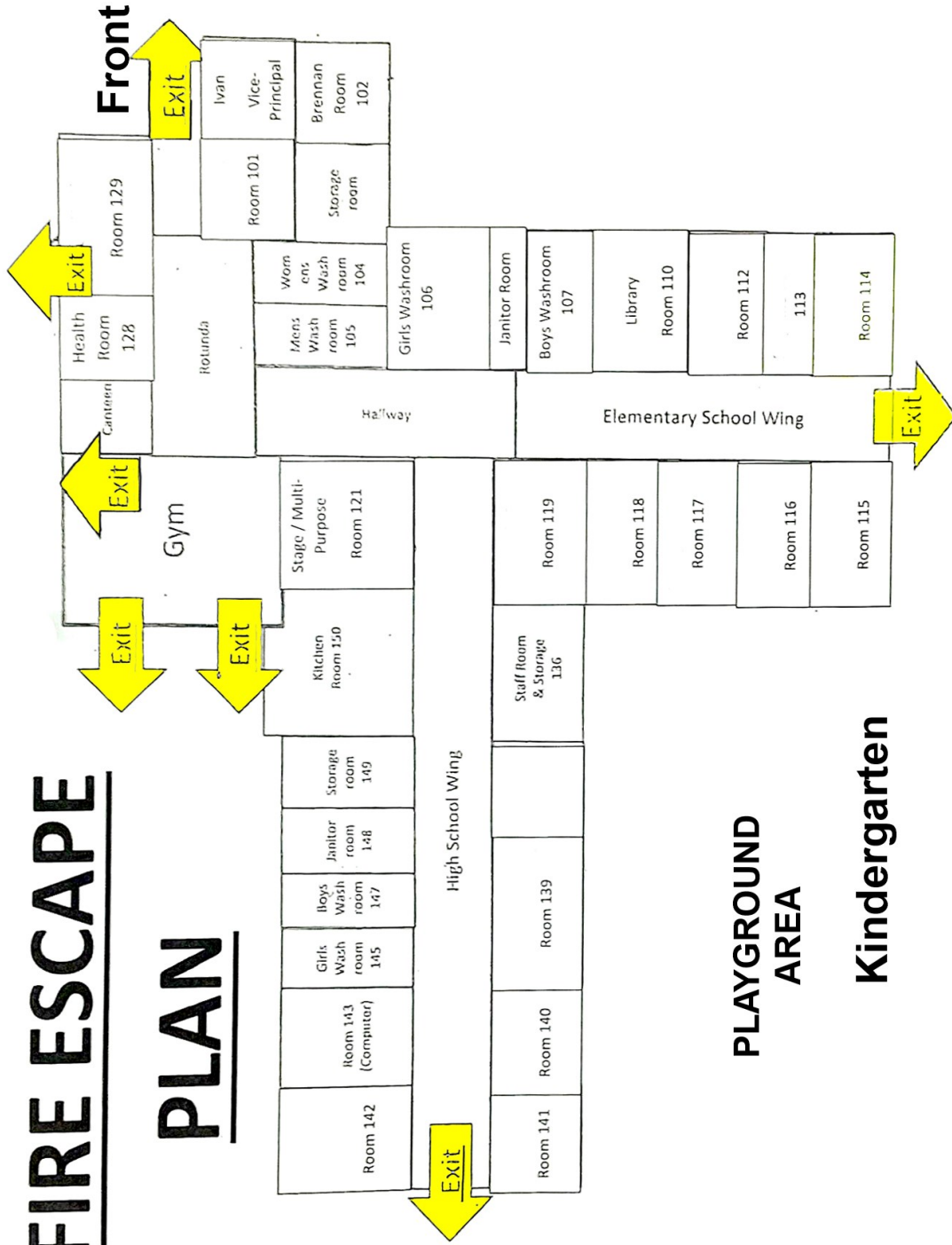
